³¹ "Behold, days are coming," says *Y'HoVaH*, "when I will make a Renewed Covenant with the house of Isra'el and with the house of Y'hudah, ³²"not like the covenant I made with their fathers in the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. My covenant which they broke, although I was a husband to them," says *Y'HoVaH*. ³³ "But this is the Covenant I will make with the house of Israel after those days," says *Y'HoVaH*, "I will put My Torah within them and on their heart I will write it; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. ³⁴ No longer will any of them teach his fellow community member or his brother, '[Do you] know *Y'HoVaH*'; for all will know me, from the least of them to the greatest; because I will forgive their wickedness and remember their sins no more." (*Jeremiah 31:31-34*)
