ka'mo'cha l'rei'a'cha V'a'hav'ta

“You shall love your neighbour as yourself.”

. . . “And these words that I command you today shall be in your heart. And you shall teach them diligently to your children.

And you shall speak of them when you sit at home, and when you walk along the way, and when you lie down and when you rise up . . .



The Shema שְׁמַע

(Deuteronomy 6:5-9; Numbers 15:37-40)

. . . “And you shall bind them as a sign upon your hand [in everything you do], and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes [in everything you think and say].

And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and upon your gates.”

“And you are to wear tzitzit [fringes], to look at, and remember to obey all my commandments, and be holy unto your God.” . . .

“And if you obey my commandment to love the Lord your God, and to serve me with all your heart and with all your soul, then I will give you rain in its season, the former rain and the latter rain, and you will gather in your grain, your wine, and your oil...”
