Moshe makes the Israelites paint doorposts and lintels with the blood of a sacrificial lamb, so the firstborn sons of Israel can be spared by Y'HOVAH. (<u>Ex.12:12-13</u>)	Y'HOVAH's firstborn Son, Yeshua voluntarily sheds His own blood as the sacrificial lamb, so all who are born can be spared. (Jn.3:16; Eph.1:7; Col.1:14; Heb.9:12)
Before his ministry began, Moshe was a Prince of Egypt, and then tested in the desert for 40 years. (Ex.2:10)	Before his ministry began, Yeshua was the Prince of Peace, and tested in the desert for 40 days. Isa.9:5; Mat.28:18; Lk2:14
As a bridegroom, Moshe married a woman who was not a Hebrew (Num.12:1)	As a bridegroom, Yeshua calls out his bride (the 'lost sheep of the House of Israel' from amongst the Gentiles. (Matt.25:1-13)
Moshe was the mediator between Y'HOVAH and the nation of Israel. (Num.14)	Yeshua is the mediator between Y'HOVAH and all nations (1Tim.2:5)
Moshe exhorted the nation of Israel to have faith in Y'HOVAH (Gal.3:19)	Yeshua exhorts all people to have faith in Y'HOVAH (Heb.12:24)
Moshe offered his life for the salvation of his people after the sin of the golden calf. (Ex.32:33-33)	Yeshua offered His life for the salvation of the world. (Is.53:12; Rom.5:12 and 6:10; 2Cor.5:15-21; Col.1:19- 20 and 2:14-15; 1John.1:7 and 2:2; etc.)

Moshe commanded the people to remember how Y'HOVAH redeemed them from slavery by celebrating Pesach. (<u>Ex.12:14-21</u>)	Yeshua commanded His disciples to remember Him as Y'HOVAH's Redeemer whenever they keep Pesach. (<u>Lk.22:19</u>)
