This season affords one of the best opportunities of the year to share the Passover in a way which links the Jewish Believer (a person who has accepted Jesus as the Messiah who died and was resurrected for our sins). You will learn more about this great Biblical Feast—especially how Passover points to Jesus. The Passover Supper is all about an eternal redemption away from this world through the death and resurrection of the Firstborn Son. One of the best ways to explore this festival is to read lots more messianic articles about how Jesus fits into the Passover story.

Why Is Passover So Powerful?

What makes Passover so powerful? Come, taste and see! The Passover celebration is first on the Hebrew Calendar year, being the most significant of God's Appointed times.

Even though all of the Biblical Feasts highlight our Messiah—none of them matter unless we first have redemption through His blood sacrifice, in which we believe through our faith and obedience.

Three-and-a-half thousand years ago, God commanded the Israelites (including all who were grafted into Israel) to never forget that it was He

Who redeemed them through the death of the firstborn son; that they should keep this Feast from generation to generation in order to teach their children the amazing salvation He orchestrated for His people, so in their remembrance of this Biblical event, future generations will inevitably accept the death of His Firstborn as their Redeemer.

The New Testament and the Old Testament continue to reinforce this celebration of the Feast of Passover and this amazing story of redemption. (1 Corinthians 5:8)
